**Individualism vs Collectivism** Individualistic cultures prioritize individual needs and achievements while collectivist cultures focus on group harmony and shared goals Example In individualistic cultures like the United States direct negotiation and assertive communication are common while in collectivist cultures like China building relationships and maintaining harmony are paramount

**Power Distance** This dimension describes the acceptance of unequal distribution of power within society Example In high power distance cultures like India deference to authority is expected while in low power distance cultures like Denmark more egalitarian communication is common

**Time Orientation** Cultures differ in their perception of time with some prioritizing punctuality and deadlines while others are more relaxed and flexible Example In monochronic cultures like Germany time is seen as linear and deadlines are strictly adhered to while in polychronic cultures like Mexico multiple tasks are often undertaken simultaneously and deadlines are less rigid
